Dear Minister Aly,

Re: 77.9% of NSW-based services do not support ACECQA's proposal to change the notification period for assessment & rating to 1-5 days

The Australian Childcare Alliance (ACA) NSW is the largest peak body representing the privately-owned early childhood education and care sector serving over 1,600 services primarily across New South Wales. Our members collectively employ over 25,000 staff and support over 125,000 families.

As a member of the Education Council, you would be aware of ACECQA's <u>announcement</u> in November 2022 that all state/territory regulatory authorities will change their Assessment & Rating process in 2023, in particular:

- "a shift to a shorter notice period of 1-5 days for most assessment and rating visits"; and
- "Approved providers should ensure an up-to-date QIP (or Self-Assessment Working Document in NSW) is uploaded to the National Quality Agenda IT System portal or via any other jurisdiction specific submission process."

In the context of severe and worsening labour shortages, ACA NSW's <u>survey results</u> of NSW-based early childhood education and care services in particular suggest that:

- 77.9% of respondents are against ACECQA's proposal to change the notification period for A&R to 1-5 days;
- 77.92% of respondents believe this change will put more pressure on existing early childhood educators/teachers;
- 75.93% of respondents believe this change will put excessive pressure on existing early childhood educators/teachers;
- 69.23% of respondents believe this change will mean some/many staff will never be able to schedule approved leave (eg annual leave, holiday, breaks) with confidence; and
- 66.50% of respondents believe this change will push more early childhood educators/teachers to leave the sector.

And while ACECQA's proposal did include references to partial assessment and ratings of services, it did not expressly limit the change of the notification period to exclusively partial assessments.

As such, ACA NSW is extremely concerned that this proposed change will have far more negative than positive consequences for NSW-based services, educators and teachers.

We are also concerned that this announcement was made when there is <u>between 33.2% and 64.1% of NSW-based services who, in our opinion, are overdue</u> for assessment and ratings. In fact, 1 NSW-based long daycare service (rated Excellent) and 2 NSW-based family daycare services (rated Working Towards the NQS) have not had their assessment and rating since 2016.

In December 2022, ACA NSW did discuss our concerns with ACECQA and the NSW Department of Education.

The NSW Regulatory Authority did publicly <u>broadcast</u> that "... *there are no imminent changes to assessment and rating*" and assured us that they will engage firstly with the (NSW) sector through various forums in February and March 2023 as well as prior their own engagements.

ACA NSW is not aware of any other regulatory authority communique or clarification since.

Hence, with <u>growing media coverage</u> of NSW-based services' concerns about having adequate numbers of educators and teachers to provide the necessary education and care of children, NSW-based services are therefore right to be extremely concerned about their services' viabilities should ACECQA's announcement be implemented verbatim.

Such concerns also coincided with the NSW Productivity Commissioner's third report in December 2022, "*Evaluation of NSW-specific early childcare regulations*", which declared that "... the cost of NSW maintaining requirements above the national standards equates to around \$3,000 a year for each child attending ECEC."

Changes to quality assessment and rating

6 December 2022

Good afternoon

ACECQA recently published information about planned national changes to how regulatory authorities (including NSW) undertake assessment and rating under the National Quality Framework, set to occur in 2023.

The NSW Regulatory Authority wants to assure you that there are no imminent changes to assessment and rating in NSW. Partial assessment and rating will be implemented slowly with an incremental rollout planned to commence from mid-April 2023. The roll out approach will further inform the most effective way to implement the changes whilst enabling the best features of a partial assessment and rating to be realised.

We acknowledge that this initiative represents change for the sector and sits alongside a range of other changes the sector is working through. To support the change process and enable more dialogue about the new partial assessment and rating approach, we will be engaging with the Early Childhood and Advisory Group (ECAG), the Aboriginal Advisory Group (AAG) and peak bodies on the NSW approach so that we can understand how to best tailor this initiative to the NSW context.

Further to this, we intend to speak with you at various forums during February and March to provide information on the NSW approach and answer any questions you may have.

How you will be supported

- Roadshows will be conducted by the NSW Regulatory Authority to educate the sector on the upcoming changes and how services can prepare.
- The NSW Regulatory Authority will engage with the sector through established advisory groups and peak bodies on how this will look in NSW.
- The NSW Regulatory Authority is developing an online live self-assessment and quality improvement planning portal that will facilitate services to be "always ready" for assessment and rating and support services to engage in a continuous improvement journey.
- Transparent communication will occur from the NSW Regulatory Authority to the sector throughout the implementation of the new approach.
